

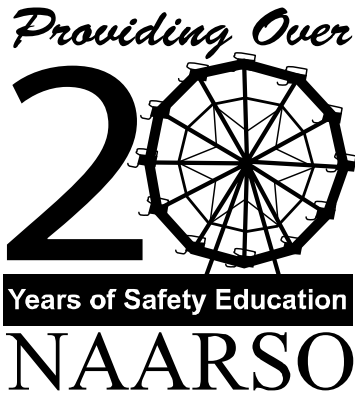

LIMITED SPECIALTY TRAINING & CERTIFICATION

In conjunction with the 22nd Annual Safety Forum, NAARSO is please to extend additional training and certification for those individuals involved in the Rental side of the Amusement Industry. This training will cover Inflatable Devices, Rock Walls, Euro Bungees/Bungee Jumps, and Trackless Trains. Classes take place on Saturday and Sunday, January 24 and 25, 2009, at the Music Road Hotel & Conference Center located in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee. It will include instruction in the areas of Inspection Procedures, Safe Operating Procedures, ASTM Standards, Fasteners, Wire Rope, Electrical Codes and Recommended Documentation Practices.

Registration will begin at 8:00 a.m. on Saturday, January 24 with instruction beginning at 9:00 a.m. The Limited Specialty certification exam will take place on Sunday at 10:30 a.m. ending around 12:00 p.m. The course fee is over and above the 22nd Annual Forum and is \$100. The Limited Specialty certification test fee is \$55 for those individuals who have a 2009 NAARSO membership, \$160 for any applicant that chooses not to become a member of NAARSO. MONDAY & TUESDAY CLASSES

The classes for Monday and Tuesday are broken up into two (2) groups; Primary and Secondary. Your path for these two days is determined by your previous training experience and/or years in the industry.

Primary Curriculum:

Covers basic inspection points and techniques as well as basic electric, hydraulics, and other related subjects. This curriculum is recommended for those who:

1. Have never attended a NAARSO or other certified safety seminar or,
2. Feel they can benefit from an intense two (2) day course on inspection techniques, hydraulics, electrics, and other related subjects or,
3. Are taking the Level I exam.

Secondary Curriculum:

Consists of elective one (1) hour classes covering different topics that include inspection of specific types of devices, codes and standards, employee safety, and other topics not related to basic ride inspections. This curriculum is recommended for those who:

1. Have a good understanding of inspection techniques, hydraulics, electrics or,
2. Have attended a NAARSO or other certified safety seminar in the past or,
3. Currently hold a Level I certification.

If you feel that you will be taking the Secondary Curriculum, below please find your class options. The class schedule for Monday will be repeated on Tuesday, so you will need to choose a class each hour for the two (2) days.

ELECTIVE CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

ASTM WORLD STANDARDS – THIS NEW STANDARD WILL BE DISCUSSED IN DETAIL BY ONE OF THE MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE RESPONSIBLE FOR ITS DEVELOPMENT.

AERIAL TRAMWAYS – A TWO (2) HOUR CLASS WITH DISCUSSION OF B77 INSPECTION STANDARDS PERTAINING TO VARIOUS TYPES OF AERIAL TRAMWAYS WITH FIXED GRIP AND REMOVEABLE GRIPS AND INCLUDES VARIOUS WIRE ROPE DEFECTS, DAMAGE, AND MAINTENANCE.

BEARINGS – DISCUSSION ABOUT THE APPLICATION AND INSPECTION OF DIFFERENT TYPES OF BEARINGS USED IN THE AMUSEMENT INDUSTRY.

CHAINS – A REVIEW OF ISSUES WHICH ARISE WITH THE USE OF DIFFERENT TYPES OF CHAINS.

CLIMBING WALLS – THIS HANDS-ON CLASS WILL COVER THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF CLIMBING WALLS, INSPECTION TECHNIQUES, AND VARIOUS MANUFACTURERS' REQUIREMENTS.

COMMISSIONING A NEW RIDE – A ONE HOUR CLASS ON ASTM CONSIDERATIONS WHEN COMMISSIONING A RIDE NEW TO AN OWNER. DISCUSSION WILL ADDRESS ITEMS REQUIRED FROM THE MANUFACTURER WHEN DELIVERING A NEW RIDE ALONG WITH WHAT THE REQUIREMENTS ARE FOR DIFFERENT STATES.

CORROSION ANALYSIS – WHAT IS CORROSION? WHAT IS RUST? DO YOU KNOW THE DIFFERENCE? THIS CLASS WILL INCLUDE THE VARIOUS TECHNIQUES UTILIZED IN THE INSPECTION PROCESS.

DARK RIDES & WALK THROUGH INSPECTIONS – THIS INSTRUCTIONAL TIME WILL DISCUSS A MYRIAD OF SAFETY ISSUES COMMON TO DARK RIDES, WALK THROUGH FUN HOUSES, GLASS HOUSES.

DEVELOPING AN INSPECTION PROGRAM – HOW TO DEVELOP A GOOD RIDE INSPECTION PROGRAM THAT COMPLIES WITH THE ASTM STANDARDS.

DEVELOPING A MAINTENANCE TRAINING PROGRAM – INSTRUCTION ON HOW TO DEVELOP A MAINTENANCE TRAINING PROGRAM THAT COMPLIES WITH THE ASTM STANDARDS.

GO KARTS – AN OVERVIEW OF GO KART INSPECTION TECHNIQUES INCLUDING KART AND TRACK, ALONG WITH DISCUSSIONS ON OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES.

INFLATABLE INSPECTIONS – A PRESENTATION OF THE PROPER OPERATIONAL AND INSPECTION PROGRAMS FOR VARIOUS INFLATABLE RIDES.

INSPECTION TOOLS – EXAMPLES OF TYPICAL TOOLS THAT WOULD BE USEFUL DURING THE INSPECTION PROCESS AND A DISCUSSION ON HOW TO USE THEM.

KNOW YOUR WHEELS – DISCUSSION ON THE LARGE VARIETY OF WHEELS AND WHEEL TYPES AVAILABLE FOR USE ON AMUSEMENT RIDES AND DEVICES. YOU WILL ALSO DISCUSS WHY CERTAIN TYPES OF WHEELS MIGHT BE BETTER FITTED TO SOME APPLICATIONS MORE THAN OTHERS.

NON DESTRUCTIVE TESTING – THIS CLASS WILL DISCUSS THE VARIOUS TYPES OF NON DESTRUCTIVE TESTING AVAILABLE INCLUDING XRAY, ULTRASOUND, MAG. PARTICLE, AND DYE PENETRANTS. YOU WILL ALSO DISCUSS WHICH TYPES ARE BETTER SUITED TO THE COMPONENT TO BE TESTED.

OREGON/EYERLY RIDES - A DISCUSSION WITH A COMPANY REPRESENTATIVE ABOUT THIS MANUFACTURER'S PRODUCTS.

OSHA/FALL ARREST – DISCUSSION ON HOW OSHA REQUIREMENTS AFFECT AMUSEMENT INSPECTION PERSONNEL ALONG WITH DISCUSSIONS ON THE PROPER USE OF FALL ARREST GEAR.

RECENT BULLETIN REVIEW – A REVIEW OF BULLETINS THAT HAVE BEEN RELEASED BY MANUFACTURERS.

STEEL COASTERS – INFORMATION WILL BE PROVIDED ON HOW BEST TO PERFORM AN INSPECTION ON STEEL COASTER TRACKS AND VEHICLES. ENSUING DISCUSSION WILL HELP YOU DETERMINE WHERE TO BEGIN, WHAT ARE POTENTIAL PROBLEMS, AND WHAT TO DO IF A DEFECT IS DISCOVERED.

UNDERSTANDING WELDING & NDT CERTIFICATIONS – THIS CLASS WILL OFFER AN EXPLANATION OF THE CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR ASNT, WELDING, & NON DESTRUCTIVE TESTING LEVELS.

UNUSUAL SITUATION & DISASTER PLANNING – HOW TO BE PREPARED FOR SITUATIONS SUCH AS SUDDEN BAD WEATHER, POWER OUTAGES, ETC.

WATER PARKS – THIS CLASS WILL DISCUSS THE VARIOUS ATTRACTIONS COMMON IN TODAY'S PARKS. ALONG WITH POTENTIAL PROBLEM AREAS AND THE BEST APPROACH TO DOING MEANINGFUL INSPECTION OF THE GROUNDS, STRUCTURES, AND WATER IN THE PARKS WITH AN EYE TOWARD ELMINATING POTENTIAL RISK TO PATRONS.

WELDING INSPECTIONS – DURING THIS CLASS DISCUSSION YOU WILL LEARN THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF WELDS YOU ARE LIKELY TO ENCOUNTER IN THE INDUSTRY AND HOW TO RECOGNIZE THE VARIOUS DISCONTINUITIES AND DEFECTS.

WIRE ROPE INSPECTION – THIS SESSION WILL DISCUSS THE PROPER APPLICATION OF WIRE ROPE AND THE VARIOUS INSPECTION TECHNIQUES. WE WILL ALSO EVALUATE DIFFERENT TYPES OF ROPE DAMAGE.
