# MONDAY & TUESDAY CLASSES

## GENERAL CLASSES

The general track of classes for Monday and Tuesday are broken up into two (2) groups; Primary and Secondary. Your path for these two days is determined by your previous training experience and/or years in the industry. For those of you interested in taking the Secondary Curriculum, any of the Operations classes are also available to you. *Because of exam eligibility requirements, if you are interested in taking either of the Operations Certification exams, you will need to refer to the appropriate track of classes for that test.*

### General Primary Curriculum:

Your schedule for Monday and Tuesday covers basic inspection points and techniques as well as basic electric, hydraulics, and other related subjects. If you are interested in this track of classes, you will not need to make any other class selections for the first two days. However, you will need to provide your selections for Thursday. This curriculum is recommended for those who:

1. Have never attended a NAARSO or other certified safety seminar or,
2. Feel they can benefit from an intense two (2) day course on inspection techniques, hydraulics, electrics, and other related subjects or,
3. Are taking the Level I exam.

### General Secondary Curriculum:

Your schedule for Monday and Tuesday consists of elective classes covering different topics that include inspection of specific types of devices, codes and standards, employee safety, and other topics not related to basic ride inspections. You will need to provide your selections for Monday and for Tuesday on the registration form. As mentioned above, any of the Operations classes (**Orange** / **Purple**) are available to you. This curriculum is recommended for those who:

1. Have a good understanding of inspection techniques, hydraulics, electrics or,
2. Have attended a NAARSO or other certified safety seminar in the past or,
3. Currently hold a Level I certification.

## OPERATIONS CLASSES

To serve this new branch of certification we have developed a Level II track of Operations classes that are required if you wish to sit for the Level II Operations certification exam. We are also continuing the Level I track of Operations classes for those individuals just starting out in this sector of the amusement ride industry.

### Level I Operations

Individuals interested in taking the Operations Level I certification exam must take the schedule of classes highlighted in **Orange** on either Monday *or* Tuesday as well as the classes highlighted in **Orange** on the Thursday elective page. Your schedule for the second day of your Monday/Tuesday classes can be made up of any of the other class selections listed including any of the Operations Level II classes highlighted in **Purple**. You must have the 16 hours of Level I classes (15 classroom hours & 1 hour at the park) on your attendance chart to sit for the exam. The attendance chart will need to be brought with you to the exam room for verification.

### Level II Operations

Individuals who already hold an Operations Level I certification and who are interested in sitting for the Level II Operations exam must take the classes highlighted in **Purple** on either Monday *or* Tuesday as well as the classes highlighted in **Purple** on the Thursday elective page. Your schedule for the second day of your Monday/Tuesday classes can be made up of any of the other class selections listed including any of the Level I classes highlighted in **Orange**. You must have the 16 hours of Level II classes (15 classroom hours & 1 hour at the park) on your attendance chart to sit for the exam. The attendance chart will need to be brought with you to the exam room for verification.

# ELECTIVE CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

**ASTM F2974 – AUDITING AMUSEMENT RIDES & DEVICES** – THIS CLASS WILL GO OVER AUDITING/INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS FOR AMUSEMENT RIDES AND DEVICES AND ALL REFERENCED ASTM F24 STANDARDS.

**AERIAL TRAMWAYS** – A TWO (2) HOUR CLASS FOCUSED ON FIXED AND DETACHABLE GRIP CHAIRLIFTS AND GONDOLAS WITH DISCUSSION OF 1) ANSI B77.1 STANDARD FOR AERIAL TRAMWAYS – HOW TO USE IT AND UPDATES TO STANDARDS, 2) INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE OF AERIAL TRAMWAYS.

**AVOIDING PROBLEMS WITH ACCIDENT INVESTIGATIONS** – TO AVOID PROBLEMS DURING THIS CRITICAL TIME, LEARN THE PROPER PROCEDURES AND TOOLS NEEDED TO COMPLETE A THOROUGH AND EFFECTIVE INVESTIGATION INTO INCIDENTS.

**LUBRICATION** – AN OVERVIEW OF THE DIFFERENT TYPES OF LUBRICANTS ON THE MARKET ALONG WITH PROPER MAINTENANCE TECHNIQUES.

**NON DESTRUCTIVE TESTING** – THIS CLASS WILL DISCUSS THE VARIOUS TYPES OF NON DESTRUCTIVE TESTING AVAILABLE INCLUDING X-RAY, ULTRASOUND, MAGNETIC PARTICLE, AND DYE PENETRATE. YOU WILL ALSO DISCUSS WHICH TYPES ARE BETTER SUITED TO THE COMPONENT TO BE TESTED.

**OSHA/PERSONAL SAFETY FALL ARREST** – DISCUSSION ON HOW OSHA REQUIREMENTS AFFECT AMUSEMENT INSPECTION PERSONNEL ALONG WITH DISCUSSIONS ON THE PROPER USE OF FALL ARREST GEAR.
